

ACADEMIC PROBATION

A student who fails to achieve the specified course mark (70% or higher) at the end of a course will be placed on Academic Probation (AP). The Director will advise the student to meet with his/her Program Instructor to develop strategies to improve academic standing and to determine eligibility of course promotion.

A student will remain on Academic Probation if the specified minimum course program mark (70%) is not met for a second time. If the specified minimum course program mark is not met for a third consecutive time, the student will be academically withdrawn from his/her program.

The consequences of academic withdrawal include the student being dropped from any subsequent courses in which he/she is registered in the next course sequence and being ineligible for student loan funding. An academically withdrawn student may apply to other Health Care Aide Academy programs without a waiting period, an academically withdrawn student who wishes to return to the program should meet with his/her director to determine if there are changes to graduation requirements.

If the student fails to achieve the specified minimum semester program mark, he/she will be permanently withdrawn from the program.

Academic probation and academic withdrawals are permanently noted on the student's official transcript.
